

The uOttawa Faculty of Medicine hosted the event at uOttawa's Roger Guindon Hall, with contributions from The Ottawa Hospital, CHEO, uOttawa, and local Indigenous clinical leaders. A crowd of over 100 staff and learners gathered to pause and reflect on the role that relationships play in advancing reconciliation within clinical practice, especially in relation to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Call to Action #22.
